

~CHAPTER 24-A~

TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

Section 24-1. Definitions.

Terms used in this chapter, unless the content otherwise plainly requires, shall mean:

1. **Alley** - A minor public way having a narrow right-of-way and affording a secondary means of access to abutting properties.
2. **Authorized emergency vehicle** - Vehicles of the Fire Department, police vehicles, and ambulances; and also vehicles owned or operated by members of the Fire Department for emergency purposes.
3. **Boulevard** - The area of the public right-of-way lying between the established roadway and the adjacent property line that is set aside for public utilities, utility poles, sidewalks or walk ways, and fire hydrants.
4. **Crosswalk** - Any portion of a roadway at an intersection or elsewhere distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing by lines or other markings on the surface.
5. **Curb loading zone** - A space adjacent to a curb reserved for the exclusive use of vehicles during the loading or unloading of passengers or materials.
6. **Driver** - Every person who drives or is in actual physical control of a vehicle.
7. **Intersections** - The area embraced within the prolongation or connection of the lateral curb lines, or, if none, then the lateral boundary lines of the roadways of two streets which join one another at or approximately at right angles, or the area within which vehicles traveling upon different highways joining at any other angle may come in conflict.

Where a highway includes two roadways thirty feet (30') or more apart, then every crossing of each roadway of such divided highway by an intersecting highway shall be regarded as a separate intersection. In the event intersecting highway also includes two roadways thirty feet (30') or more apart, then every crossing of two roadways of such highways shall be regarded as a separate intersection.

8. **Laned roadway** - A roadway which is divided into two or more clearly marked lanes for traffic.
9. **Motorcycle** - Every motor vehicle designed to travel on not more than three (3) wheels in contact with the ground, except any such vehicles as may be included within the term 'tractor' as herein defined.
10. **Official time standard** - Wherever certain hours are named herein, they shall mean standard time or daylight savings time as may be in current use in this City.
11. **Official traffic control devices** - All signs, signals, markings, and devices, not inconsistent with this ordinance placed or erected by authority of a public body or official having jurisdiction for the purpose of regulating, warning, or guiding traffic.
12. **Park or parking** - When prohibited, means the standing of vehicle, whether occupied or not, other than temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading merchandise or passengers.
13. **Pedestrian** - Any person afoot.
14. **Person** - Every natural person, firm, partnership, association, or corporation.
15. **Police Officer** - Every officer of the municipal Police Department or any officer authorized to direct or regulate traffic or to make arrests for violations of traffic regulations.
16. **Private road or driveway** - Every road or driveway not open to the use of the public for purpose of vehicular travel.
17. **Right-of-way** -
 - a. The privilege of the immediate use of the roadway.
 - b. A strip of land that, upon development of a property, is dedicated as 'public right-of-way' for streets, sidewalks, utilities and similar public uses.
18. **Roadway** - That portion of a street or highway improved, designed, or ordinarily used for vehicular travel. In the event a highway includes two or more separate roadways, the term "roadway" as used herein shall refer to any such roadway separately but not to all such roadways collectively.

19. **Stop** - When required, means complete cessation of movement.
20. **Stop, stopping, or standing** - When prohibited, means any stopping or standing of a vehicle whether occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or traffic control sign or signal.
21. **Sidewalk, Public** - That portion of the street right-of-way between the established roadway and adjacent property line that is set aside for the use of pedestrians.
22. **Street or highway** - Every way or place of whatever nature dedicated and open to the use of the public, as a matter of right, for purposes of travel and public use.
23. **Traffic** - Pedestrians, ridden or herded animals, vehicles, and other conveyances either singly or together while using any street for purposes of travel.
24. **Through street or highway** - Every street or highway or portion thereof at the entrances to which vehicular traffic from intersecting streets or highways is required by law to stop before entering or crossing the same and when stop signs are erected as provided in this act.
25. **Traffic control signal**- Any device, whether manually, electrically, or mechanically operated, by which traffic is alternately directed to stop and to proceed.
26. **Vehicle** - Every device in, upon, or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway, except devices used exclusively upon stationery rails or tracks, provided that for purposes of this chapter, a bicycle or a ridden animal shall be deemed a vehicle.

24-A.02. Duty of Police Department.

24-A.02.010. Duty of Police Department.

It shall be the duty of the Police Department to enforce the street traffic regulations of this City and all of the State vehicle laws applicable to street traffic in this City.

24-A.03. Traffic and Traffic Accidents; Recording.

24-A.03.010. Records of Traffic Violations.

- A. The Police Department shall keep a record of all violations of the traffic ordinances of this City or of the State vehicle laws of which any person has been charged, together with a record of the final disposition of all such alleged offenses.
- B. Such record shall be so maintained as to show all types of violations and the total of each.

24-A.03.020. Police Department to Investigate Accidents.

It shall be the duty of the Police Department to investigate traffic accidents, to arrest and to assist in the prosecution of those persons charged with violations of law causing or contributing to such accident.

24-A.03.030. Traffic Accident Studies.

Whenever the accidents at any particular location become numerous, the Police Department shall conduct studies of such accidents and determine remedial measures.

24-A.03.040. Traffic Accident Reports.

The Police Department shall maintain a suitable system of filing traffic accident reports. Accident reports or cards referring to them shall be filed alphabetically by location.

24-A.03.050. Drivers Files to be Maintained.

The Police Department shall maintain a suitable record of all traffic accidents, warnings, arrests, convictions, and complaints reported for each driver.

24-A.03.060. Police Department to Submit Annual Traffic Safety Report.

The Police Department shall annually prepare a traffic report which shall be filed with the Finance Officer. Such reports shall contain information on traffic matters in this City as follows:

- A. The number of traffic accidents, the number of persons killed, the number of persons injured, and other pertinent traffic accident data.
- B. The number of traffic accidents investigated and other pertinent data on the safety activities of the police.

24-A.04. Police and Fire Department Officials; Emergency Vehicles.

24-A.04.010. Authority of Police and Fire Department Officials.

- A. It shall be the duty of the officers of the Police Department or such officers as are assigned by the Chief of Police to enforce all street traffic laws of the City and all of the State vehicle laws applicable to street traffic in this City.
- B. Officers of the Police Department or such officers as are assigned by the Chief of Police are hereby authorized to direct all traffic by voice, hand, or signal in conformance with traffic laws, provided that, in the event of a fire or other emergency or to expedite traffic or to safeguard pedestrians, officers of the Police Department may direct traffic as conditions may require notwithstanding the provisions of the traffic laws.
- C. Officers of the Fire Department, when at the scene of a fire, may direct or assist the police in directing traffic thereat or in the immediate vicinity.

24-A.04.020. Obedience to Police and Fire Department Officials.

No person shall willfully fail or refuse to comply with any lawful order or direction of a police officer or fire department official.

24-A.04.030. Exemptions to Authorized Emergency Vehicles.

The provisions of this ordinance regulating the operation, parking, and standing of vehicles shall apply to authorized emergency vehicles, as defined in this ordinance, except as follows:

- A. A driver, when operating any such vehicle in an emergency, except when otherwise directed by a police officer, may:
 - 1. Park or stand notwithstanding the provisions of this ordinance;
 - 2. Proceed past a red or stop signal or stop sign, but only after slowing down as may be necessary for safe operation;
 - 3. Exceed the prima facie speed limits so long as he does not endanger life or property;
 - 4. Disregard regulations governing direction of movement or turning in specified directions so long as he does not endanger life or property.

- B. These exemptions hereinbefore granted in reference to the movement of an authorized emergency vehicle shall apply only when the driver of said vehicle sounds audible signals by siren, horn, or bell, or emergency lights.
- C. The foregoing exemptions shall not, however, protect the driver of any such vehicle from the consequences of his reckless disregard of the safety of others.

24-A.04.040. Operation of Vehicles on Approach of Authorized Emergency Vehicles.

- A. Upon the approach of any authorized emergency vehicle giving visual and/or audible signals by siren, horn, or bell, or emergency lights the driver of every other vehicle shall immediately drive the same to a position as near as possible and parallel to the right-hand edge or curb of the street, clear of any intersection of streets, and shall stop and remain in such position unless otherwise directed by a police or traffic officer until the authorized emergency vehicle shall have passed.
- B. This section shall not operate to relieve the driver of an authorized emergency vehicle from the duty to drive with due regard for the safety of all persons using the highway.

24-A.05. Traffic Control Devices.

24-A.05.010. Traffic Control Devices.

The Police Department shall place and maintain traffic control signs, signals, and devices when and as required under the traffic ordinances of the City to make effective the provisions of said ordinances, and may place and maintain such additional traffic control devices as it may deem necessary to regulate traffic under the traffic ordinances of this City or under State law, or to guide or warn traffic. The driver of any vehicle shall obey the instructions of any official traffic control device applicable thereto unless otherwise directed by a police officer, subject to the exceptions granted the driver of an authorized emergency vehicle in this ordinance.

24-A.05.020. When Traffic Devices Required for Enforcement Purposes.

No provision of this ordinance for which signs are required shall be enforced against an alleged violator if at the time and place of the alleged violation if an official sign is not in proper position and sufficiently legible to be seen by an ordinarily observant person. Whenever a particular section does not state that signs are required, such section shall be effective even though no signs are erected or in place.

24-A.05.030. Display of Unauthorized Signs, Signals, or Markings.

- A. No person shall place, maintain, or display upon or in view of any highway, any unauthorized sign, signal, marking, or device which purports to be or is an imitation of or resembles an official traffic control device or railroad sign or signal, or which attempts to direct the movement of traffic, or which hides from view or interferes with the effectiveness of any official traffic control device or any railroad sign or signal, and no person shall place or maintain nor shall public authority permit upon any highway any traffic sign or signal bearing thereon any commercial advertising. This shall not be deemed to prohibit the erection upon private property adjacent to highways of signs giving useful directional information and of a type that cannot be mistaken for official signs,
- B. Every such prohibited sign, signal, or marking is hereby declared to be a public nuisance and the authority having jurisdiction over the highway is hereby empowered to remove the same or cause it to be removed without notice.

24-A.05.040. Interferences with Official Traffic Control Devices.

No person shall, without the lawful authority, attempt to or in fact alter, deface, injure, knock down or remove any official traffic control device.

24-A.06. Play Streets.

24-A.06.010. Authority to Establish Play Street.

The Police Department shall have authority to declare any street or part thereof a play street and to place appropriate signs or devices in the roadway indicating and helping to protect the same.

24-A.06.020. Play Streets.

Whenever authorized signs are erected indicating any street or part thereof as a play street, no person shall drive a vehicle upon any such street or portion thereof except drivers of vehicles having business or whose residences are within such closed area, and then any said driver shall exercise the greatest care in driving upon any such street or portion thereof.

24-A.07. Speed Limits.

24-A.07.010. Speed Limits.

- A. The speed limit on all streets in the City shall be twenty-five (25) miles per hour, except as otherwise specifically posted or provided hereinafter.
- B. No person shall drive a vehicle upon any alley or in any municipal park of the City at a speed in excess of fifteen (15) miles per hour.

24-A.08. Intersections; Stopping, Turning, Obedience to Signage.

24-A.08.010. Authority to Place and Obedience to Turning Markers.

- A. The Police Department is authorized to place markers, buttons, or signs within or adjacent to intersections indicating the course to be traveled by vehicles turning at such intersections, and such course to be traveled as so indicated may conform to or be other than as prescribed by law or ordinance.
- B. When authorized markers, buttons, or other indications are placed within an intersection indicating the course to be traveled by vehicles turning thereat, no driver of a vehicle shall disobey the directions of such indications.

24-A.08.020. Authority to Place Restricted Turn Signs.

The Police Department is hereby authorized to determine those intersections at which drivers of vehicles shall not make a right, left, or U-turn, and shall place proper signs at such intersections. The making of such turns may be prohibited between certain hours of any day and permitted at other hours, in which event the same shall be plainly indicated on the signs or they may be removed when such turns

are permitted.

24-A.08.030. Obedience to No Turn Signs.

Whenever authorized signs are erected indicating that no right or left or U-turn is permitted, no driver of a vehicle shall disobey the directions of any such sign.

24-A.08.040. 'U-Turns' and Traveling on the Left Side.

No vehicle shall cross over from the right side of the street to the left side, except to enter a premise with off street parking or make a turn of over ninety degrees (90°) upon any street, except upon the intersection of one street with another or to enter an alley. Any such authorized cross over or turn shall be made only after yielding to oncoming traffic.

24-A.08.050. Authority to Erect Traffic Control and Public Safety Signage.

The Police Department, by resolution of the Common Council, is hereby authorized to designate and properly sign locations for parking, traffic control, and public safety. It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to fail to obey any such duly erected sign. If such driver is involved in a collision with a vehicle in the intersection after driving past a yield sign without stopping, such collision shall be deemed prima facie evidence of his failure to yield right-of-way.

24-A.08.060. Emerging from Alley.

The driver of a vehicle emerging from an alley, driveway, or building shall stop such vehicle immediately prior to driving onto a sidewalk or onto the sidewalk area extending across any alleyway, yielding the right-of-way to all vehicles approaching on said roadway.

24-A.08.070. Stop When Traffic Obstructed.

No driver shall enter an intersection or a marked crosswalk unless there is sufficient space on the other side of the intersection or crosswalk to accommodate the vehicle he is operating without obstructing the passage of other vehicles or pedestrians, notwithstanding any traffic control signal indication to proceed.

24-A.09. Vehicles on Roadway, General; Crosswalks, Pedestrians.

24-A.09.010. Driving Through Funeral or Other Procession.

No driver of a vehicle shall drive between the vehicles comprising a funeral or other authorized procession while they are in motion and when such funeral vehicles are conspicuously designated.

24-A.09.020. Driving and Parking on a Public Sidewalk and Boulevard.

1. The driver of a vehicle shall not drive or park on any public sidewalk.
2. Vehicles and trailers of all types, including travel, boat, camping and hauling, shall not be parked or stored between the back of curb and the adjacent property line along any substantially improved street.

24-A.09.030. Limitation on Backing.

The driver of a vehicle shall not back the same unless such movement can be made with reasonable safety and without interfering with other traffic.

24-A.09.040. Driver to Keep Vehicle under Control and Drive Carefully.

The driver of any vehicle shall keep such vehicle under his control while same is in motion and shall drive the same in a prudent and careful manner and with due regard to the safety and convenience of all other vehicles and pedestrians using the street.

24-A.09.050. Limitations on Overtaking and Passing.

The operator of a motor vehicle shall not overtake and pass any other motor vehicle proceeding in the same direction when traveling in the City of Hot Springs, South Dakota.

24-A.09.060. Pedestrians' Right-Of-Way in Crosswalk.

- A. When traffic control signals are not in place or not in operation, the driver of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way, slowing down or stopping if need be to so yield, to a pedestrian crossing the roadway within a crosswalk when the pedestrian is upon the half of the roadway upon which the vehicle is traveling, or when the pedestrian is approaching so closely from the opposite half of the roadway as to be in danger, but no pedestrian shall suddenly leave a curb or other place of safety and walk or run into the path of a vehicle, which is so close that it is impossible for the driver to yield.

- B. Whenever any vehicle is stopped at a marked crosswalk or at any unmarked crosswalk at an intersection to permit a pedestrian to cross the roadway, the driver of any other vehicle approaching from the rear shall not overtake and pass such stopped vehicle.

24-A.10. Parking; Obedience to Signage.

24-A.10.010. Signs or Markings Indicating Angle Parking.

The Police Department shall determine upon what streets angle parking shall be permitted and shall mark or sign such streets.

24-A.10.020. Obedience to Angle Parking Signs or Markings.

Upon those streets which have been signed or marked by the Police Department for angle parking, no person shall park or stand a vehicle other than at the angle to the curb or edge of the roadway indicated by such signs and markings.

24-A.10.030. Stopping, Standing, or Parking Prohibited, No Signs Required.

- A. No person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or traffic control device, in any of the following places:

1. on a sidewalk;
2. in front of a public or private driveway;
3. within an intersection;
4. within fifteen feet (15') of a fire hydrant;
5. on a crosswalk;
6. within twenty feet (20') of a crosswalk at an intersection;
7. within thirty feet (30') upon the approach to any flashing beacon, stop sign, or traffic control signal located at the side of a roadway;
8. within twenty feet (20') of the driveway entrance to any fire station and on the side of a street opposite the entrance to any fire station within seventy-five feet

(75') of said entrance (when properly signposted);

9. alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when stopping, standing, or parking would obstruct traffic;
10. when on the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street;
11. upon any bridge or other elevated structure upon a highway;
12. at any place where official signs prohibit stopping.

B. No person shall move a vehicle not lawfully under his control into any such prohibited area or away from a curb such distance as is unlawful.

24-A.10.040. Parking of Vehicles, Trailers and Equipment on Streets.

- A. No person shall park any vehicle upon a street, other than any alley, in such a manner or under such condition as to leave available less than ten feet (10') of the width of the roadway for free movement of vehicular traffic.
- B. It is unlawful to store or keep any motorized or non-motorized equipment, campers, motor homes, boats, trailers or other seasonal or recreational vehicles or devices along any city street for a period of time exceeding two (2) weeks in any ninety (90) day period.

24-A.10.050. Parking in Alleys.

No person shall park a vehicle within any alley in such a manner or under such conditions as to leave available less than ten feet (10') of the width of the roadway for the free movement of vehicular traffic, and no person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle within an alley in such position as to block the driveway entrance to any abutting property.

24-A.10.060. Time Limit for Parking Motor Vehicles on Certain Locations within the City.

- A. Between the hours of 9:00 o'clock a.m. and 5:00 o'clock p.m. upon every day except Sunday, no motor vehicle shall be parked for a period of more than thirty (30) minutes at or along any of the following locations within the City of Hot Springs, South Dakota:

1. On the west side of Chicago Street in front of the Post Office.

24-A.10.070. Parking for Certain Purposes Prohibited.

No person shall park a vehicle upon any roadway for the principal purpose of:

- A. Displaying such vehicle for sale;
- B. Greasing, or repairing such vehicle except repairs necessitated by an emergency.

24-A.10.080. Parking Adjacent to Schools.

- A. The Police Department is hereby authorized to erect signs indicating no parking upon that side of any street adjacent to any school property when such parking would, in its opinion, interfere with traffic or create a hazardous situation.
- B. When official signs are erected indicating no parking upon that side of a street adjacent to any school property, no person shall park a vehicle in any such designated place.

24-A.10.090. No Stopping, Standing, or Parking near Hazardous or Congested Places.

- A. The Police Department is hereby authorized to determine and designate by proper signs, places not exceeding one hundred feet (100') in length in which the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles would create an especially hazardous condition or would cause unusual delay to traffic.
- B. When official signs are erected at hazardous or congested places as authorized herein, no person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle in any such designated place.

24-A.11. Parking; Snow Removal, Vehicle Towing.

24-A.11.010. Parking; Snow Removal, Vehicle Towing.

- A. Areas for disposal of snow from City snow removal activities may be designated by the Street Superintendent with the approval of the Mayor or city Administrator. Such areas will be properly posted with signs to identify these areas as no parking areas during all snow removal activities.

- B. Areas of streets where snow buildup or icing problems occur may be designated by the Street Superintendent with the approval of the Mayor or City Administrator as no parking zones during snow removal activities.
- C. Vehicles parked in violation of A or B of this Section shall be issued a parking violation and may be towed from such no parking zone by order of the Police Department.
- D. Snow removal from driveways or parking lots shall not be deposited onto any public sidewalk or street except where expressly permitted by the Street Superintendent.
- E. Vehicles parked during or after any snow removal activities causing hazardous traffic problems, ice build-up, or parking problems because of the inability of the City to properly clean streets may be issued a parking violation. If vehicles are not removed twenty-four (24) hours after a parking violation is issued and continue to be an ice build-up problem they may be towed by order of the Police Department.

24-A.12. Loading Zones; Authority to Impound Vehicles.

24-A.12.010. Police Department to Designate Curb Loading Zones.

After application is made to the Police Department the Police Department is hereby authorized to determine the location of curb loading zones and shall place and maintain appropriate signs indicating the same and stating the hours during which the provisions of this section are applicable. All costs of signage will be paid by applicant.

24-A.12.020. Authority to Impound Vehicles

- A. Members of the Police Department are hereby authorized to remove a vehicle from a street, alley, or parking lot to the nearest garage or other place of safety or to a garage designated or maintained by the Police Department or otherwise maintained by this City under the circumstances hereinafter enumerated.
 - 1. When any vehicle is left unattended upon any bridge, viaduct, or causeway, where such vehicle constitutes an obstruction to traffic.
 - 2. When a vehicle upon a street or alley is so disabled as to constitute an obstruction

to traffic and the person or persons in charge of the vehicle are by reason of physical injury incapacitated to such an extent as to be unable to provide for its custody or removal.

3. When any vehicle is left unattended upon a street or alley and is so parked illegally as to constitute a definite hazard or obstruction to the normal movement of traffic or when any vehicle is left parked unattended upon a street or alley continuously for more than forty-eight (48) consecutive hours.
- B. Whenever an officer removes a vehicle as authorized under this ordinance and the officer knows or is able to determine from the registration records in or on the vehicle the name and address of the owner thereof, such officer shall immediately give or cause to be given notice to such owner of the fact of such removal and the reasons therefore and of the place to which such vehicle has been removed.
 - C. Whenever an officer removes a vehicle pursuant to this ordinance and does not know and is not able to determine the name of the owner, or for any other reason is unable to give the notice to the owner as hereinbefore provided, and in the event the vehicle is not returned to the owner within a period of three (3) days, then and in that event the officer shall immediately send or cause to be sent a report of such removal to the Department of Motor Vehicles, Pierre, South Dakota. Such notice shall include a description of the vehicle, the date, time, and place from which removed, the reasons for such removal, and the name and address of the place where the vehicle is stored.

24-A.13. Authority to Designate Route of Travel.

24-A.13.010. Authority to Designate Route of Travel.

- A. The Chief of Police of the City of Hot Springs is hereby authorized and empowered to designate routes of travel on public streets and highways within and through the City of Hot Springs for commercial motor carriers, trucks, and buses, and to require such motor vehicles to follow such designated routes of travel within and through said City; provided, that such motor carriers, trucks, and buses may deviate from any designated route to the extent required to reach a necessary destination within the City not located thereon.

- B. Any street within the city of Hot Springs which is not on a designated route of travel for commercial carriers, trucks, and buses may be marked with appropriate signs showing that such motor vehicles are prohibited from traveling thereon.
- C. Any driver of a commercial motor carrier, truck (except pickup trucks of not more than one and one-half (12) tons capacity and fuel oil trucks of not more than two thousand (2,000) gallons capacity), or bus, who shall operate such commercial motor carrier, truck, or bus on a street within the City of Hot Springs which has been marked with a sign or signs showing that such motor vehicle is prohibited from traveling thereon, unless such driver has deviated from a designated route in order to reach a necessary destination within said City which is not located on a designated route shall be in violation of this section and shall be punished accordingly.

24-A.14. Protective Helmet Required for Minor.

24-A.14.010. Protective Helmet Required for Minor.

- A. No person under eighteen (18) years of age may operate or ride upon a motorcycle on the public streets or highways of this State unless the person wears a protective helmet of a type meeting Department of Transportation Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 218 as in effect on January 1, 1984.
- B. No person may operate a motorcycle with any person under the age of eighteen (18) as a passenger if the passenger is not wearing a protective helmet.

24-A.15. Repealed [Ord. 1178, Eff. 5/1/17]

Section 2. That the parts of this ordinance that may be in conflict with any other ordinance of the City of Hot Springs hereby supersede any other ordinance.

**FINE/BOND SCHEDULE FOR HOT SPRINGS, SD
MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE VIOLATIONS**

Comes now the Presiding Judge of the Seventh Judicial Circuit and makes the following order, superseding all previous such orders and authorizes lay magistrates to fix bond, take fines or take personal recognizance for Hot Springs Municipal Ordinance violations as follows:

Any city ordinance not itemized above shall be treated in the same manner as a Class 2 misdemeanor, except that no violation of a city ordinance shall contemplate the possibility of a jail sentence.

The fines above itemized are only binding upon cases where a power of attorney is issued by the officer and/or when the appearance is made before a lay magistrate. State statutes provide that magistrate judges or circuit judges are not bound by this schedule.

This schedule shall be effective May 1, 2017 and shall continue in effect until further order of the Court. [Ord. 1173]
